Nikki Hill is one of Canada's most sought-after public affairs advisors having spent over 25 years working in politics, campaigns and public policy. Nikki has a passion for training advocates and leaders and has extensive experience developing and delivering educational programs.

Prior to starting her career in public affairs in 2018, she was the Director of Labour Participation at United Way of the Lower Mainland and a member of the senior management team. Prior to United Way, Nikki was the Executive Director for the Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society B.C. Chapter, where she simultaneously led government relations and strategic communications for over a dozen conservation campaigns while working with Indigenous communities, business and local stakeholders. Her time in the non-profit sector followed over a decade working for one of BC's main political parties in senior roles.

Actively engaged with many community organizations since high school, Nikki currently lends her expertise to the Board of the Public Affairs Association of Canada BC Chapter. Notably, she served as the volunteer Co-Chair of United Way's Period Promise campaign from 2018 to 2022 and in May 2022, the Government of B.C. appointed Nikki to Chair the new Period Poverty Task Force for the province.

Nikki was awarded the 2023 WXN Canada's Most Powerful Women Top 100 Award for community impact. She is the recipient of the 2020 Greater Vancouver Board of Trade Wendy McDonald Community Catalyst Award, the 2020 United Way of the Lower Mainland Joe Morris Labour Community Service Award and a nominee for the 2021 YWCA Metro Vancouver Women of Distinction award for Business and the Professions.
